3 Great Ways to identify Volunteer Leaders

- 1. Make a list of the volunteer leaders currently on your team.
- 2. Make a list of the parents you want leading in your ministry.
- 3. Make a list of high school students you want leading in your ministry.

Take that list and post it in a visible location. As God provides the opportunity, invite these people to join you in your mission to lead your ministry.

Invest in your leaders. Write out a 12 month plan for investing in your volunteer leaders.

Consider:

- What responsibilities will they have?
- What tools will you use to discover their strengths?
- What books/resources will you use to challenge them?
- How frequently will you communicate with them? Meet with them?
